INSTRUCTIONS AFTER D&E

- 1. Light vaginal bleeding is normal for up to 4 weeks after the operation. Report heavy continuous vaginal bleeding especially if associated with the passage of large clots. You can use pads or tampons as needed.
- 2. Mild to moderate lower abdominal cramps is to be expected for the first several days after the procedure. This is best treated with Advil (ibuprofen).
- 3. Breast engorgement and pain is a common and normal symptom that usually lasts for two or three days after the procedure. This should be treated with cold compresses and Advil.
- 4. Do not drive or operate hazardous machinery for at least 24 hours and not until you have discontinued the use of all pain medications.
- 5. Do not make important personal or business decisions for at least 24 hours.
- 6. Do not drink alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.
- 7. Do not engage in sexual intercourse or use tampons for two weeks.
- 8. Eat light foods (jello, soups, etc.) as you can tolerate for the first 6 hours after the procedure and then advance to your usual diet as tolerated. Drink plenty of water and nonalcoholic beverages.
- 9. You may take a shower or a bath at any time after the procedure.
- 10.Report the following danger signals to the office as soon as possible: persistent nausea or vomiting, fever greater than 100.5 (especially if associated with shaking chills), increasing abdominal pain.
- 11.A postoperative office visit is usually not needed, but you should call the office within one week to discuss the results from the procedure.

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
